

Notification Procedures for Infectious Diseases

In the event that a student is diagnosed or is suspected to have any of the infectious diseases recognized by the Japanese School Health Law, he/she will be suspended from attending classes in accordance to the “School Health and Safety Act” and the “Ordinance for Enforcement of the School Health and Safety Act” in order to prevent the spread of school infection.

When you are diagnosed or suspected to have an infectious disease at medical institution

1. Immediately notify by telephone at:

* Be sure to concentrate on recovery and refrain from going out except for medical attendance until permitted by the doctor.

* It is recommended that you should also notify your lecturers of this if they can be contacted.

2. After your get better and the treatment period prescribed by the doctor is over, visit the doctor again to have a “Certificate of Recovery from Infectious Disease Form” filled out. (*its expense must be borne by you.) The completed certificate filled out by the doctor must be promptly submitted to the appropriate Academic Affairs Section above.

3. Academic consideration during suspension of attendance is provided to you wherever possible to avoid you suffering from disadvantages in classes. In order to receive this consideration, be sure to show your lecturers a “Determination of Suspension Period from School 出席停止期間の確定” issued by the Academic Affairs Section where your “Certificate of Recovery from Infectious Disease Form” was submitted.
4. Type of Infectious Diseases and Suspension Period (example)

Infectious disease	Suspension period
Influenza	Until 5 days have passed after onset of illness and 2 days after decline of fever
Pertussis (whooping cough)	Until the distinctive cough disappears, or 5 days of appropriate antibiotic treatment is completed
Measles	Until 3 days have passed after decline of fever
Mumps	Until 5 days have passed since the onset of swelling of the parotid gland, and overall condition has improved
Rubella (three-day measles)	Until the rash disappears
Varicella (Chicken pox)	Until all the blisters have scabbed over
Pharyngoconjunctival fever (pool fever)	Until 2 days have passed after major symptoms disappear
Tuberculosis	Until a doctor determines the condition to be non-infectious
Meningococcal meningitis
